\$500 Before and After School Care Vouchers

Vouchers worth \$500 for Before and After School Care (BASC) are now available to parents and carers of children enrolled in a NSW primary school.

The NSW Government's \$155 million program for BASC vouchers are now ready to be used at participating providers to assist families with access to this important service.

The vouchers will be used to cover the parent gap fee component of your BASC session fees.

Every family with children at a NSW primary school is eligible for one voucher per child, which will mean that each child will be provided with around 60 sessions of free BASC.

You can access these vouchers via the ServiceNSW app, online or by visiting your nearest Service centre.

COVID-19 Restrictions

The NSW Government has updated it's COVID-19 settings to reflect the current health situation.

The changes include:

Masks are no longer required indoors except when on public transport, planes, airports, hospitals, aged and disability care facilities, corrections centres and indoor music festivals with more than 1000 people.

QR check-ins will only be required for nightclubs, music festivals with 1000+ people and other high risk areas.

The NSW Government's Return and Earn scheme, first introduced in 2017, has reached the enormous milestone of **7 billion drink containers recycled**.

More than \$700 million in container refunds have been earned by NSW residents and local charity organisations. This wide-spread usage has seen a reduction of 52% in the volume of drink container litter entering our environment.

In our area alone, over 50 million drink containers have been returned via the numerous Reverse Vending Machines across the community.

The Return and Earn scheme has been a tremendous triumph as **more that 78% of adults in NSW have participated in it.** I know that many local residents regularly recycle their drink containers via this method and I am so happy to see our community getting involved.
