Update to COVID Isolation Rules

The NSW Government has updated it's COVID-19 isolation rules.

The changes include:

Close contacts of a confirmed COVID-19 case are no longer required to isolate, as long as they have no symptoms and comply with the following guidelines:

- Do not visit aged care, hospitals, disability, and correctional facilities unless a special exemption applies
- Wear a face mask in indoor settings outside the home
- Undertake daily RAT tests before coming into close contact with people outside their household
- Avoid contact with elderly and immunocompromised persons where possible

\$500,000 To Revitalise Riverwood Shopping Precinct

After many years of campaigning for upgrades in Riverwood, the NSW Government has provided \$500,000 to Georges River Council to revitalise and reconnect underutilised spaces along Belmore Road.

Georges River Council Receives Green Grants Funding

The NSW Government is providing \$40,000 to Georges River Council to undertake an Open Space Tree Asset Study.


Trees and urban green spaces are an important part of creating attractive, liveable, and sustainable areas, providing social, environmental and economic benefits for local residents.

This funding was provided under the NSW Government's Greener Neighbourhoods program which aims to assist councils with the development or updating of urban forest strategies.

The NSW Government has committed to achieving an ambitious target of 40% urban tree canopy cover for Greater Sydney by 2036, with us being on track to plant 1 million tress by the end of 2022.

Supporting Before and After School Care

More than 190,000 Before and After School Care Vouchers have already been downloaded by families since the program was announced in February.

The NSW Government's \$155 million BASC Voucher Program is providing one voucher per child to every family with children aged 4-13 years attending a NSW school.

These \$500 vouchers can be accessed with just a few clicks through your Service NSW app or via visiting a Service Centre.

These vouchers are part of the NSW Government's \$235 million investment to expand access to BASC services for families.

More than 860 BASC services are currently operating across NSW. This is an increase of 154 services and 14,442 places since 2019. A further 38 tenders are currently open to provide even more services.

More Police Officers Hit The Streets

I had the privilege of personally welcoming 8 new probationary constables who have been deployed to the St George Police Area Command. There are also Savings Specialists available inperson at Service NSW centres or by phoning 13 77 88, where they can provide personalised assistance to find which initiatives are best suited to your individual needs.

Acknowledging Our Local Heroes

As the Member for Oatley, I have the opportunity to speak in Parliament about local groups and individuals who have made an exceptional contribution to our community.

For The St George Area

In Peakhurst and Lugarno a number of brand new social housing projects are taking place as part of a multi-million dollar investment in our local area.

The NSW Government is committed to ensuring that new and upgraded social housing units are made available to those in need.

A \$5.26 million 16-unit senior's complex has just been completed in Lugarno, and a \$22 million 37unit project is already under construction in Peakhurst. These projects are part of the NSW Government's \$470 million social housing redevelopment pipeline in Southern Sydney.

The brand new complex in Lugarno will provide local seniors with dedicated living spaces which can cater for the needs of our older residents.

The complex in Peakhurst will see 72 units constructed, of which 37 of them will be used for social housing, with the rest available for private purchase.

This major investment will see a number of new or upgraded housing projects pop up across our local area, helping to support construction jobs and boost economic productivity.
